Science Spat

Exciting science in Year 3: This term the children in Y3 have been learning all about different types of rock and carrying out investigations to identify their characteristics.

Zion and Ithar in Mrs McMillan's class explained how the different rocks were formed: "Sedimentary rock is made when materials and bits sink to the bottom and they get crushed together for thousands and thousands of years. Igneous rocks are made when magma comes out of a volcano and cools to make rock. These rocks can then be changed into metamorphic rock if they get very hot and are pressed together."

The girls also explained how they tested if the rocks are permeable or impermeable: "We put water in the pipette and dropped it on the rock. If it soaked in it meant the rock was permeable."

They have also been developing their vocabulary to help them learn new words to describe the characteristics of the different rocks. They could then be more precise when writing about the appearance of the rocks when they looked at them through magnifying glasses.
