Science Spot

Darwin's Delights Workshop in Year 6: As part of their work on evolution and inheritance, Y6 had a day of science learning last Friday including a workshop with Jules Howard which involved investigations of fossils, shark teeth and articulated mammal skeletons, recognising how they can tell us about the history of life on Earth which helped them understand how, through comparing fossilised remains, studying living and extinct species, Darwin managed to piece it all together with his theory of natural selection.

The children were extremely enthusiastic and asked lots of questions. Having visited the school on previous occasions delivering a range of workshops, Jules said: "It is always such a pleasure working with the classes at William Alvey. Your students always display a real understanding of the idea that science is about questions, about pushing the boundaries of what we know and don't know. It's such a genuine joy to see them joining up the dots in their learning during sessions. Sign of a great science ethos!"
