ENGLISH

We will be continuing Talk4Reading lessons again this year and your child will be used to this fun way of learning from Year 5. This is how we will begin most of our days. Our first class story is beautiful, but you'll have to wait to find out what it is - it's a surprise! Because reading is so important, we hope the children can continue to read their Renaissance books at home. It really is the single best thing you can do to support your child's learning.

We are starting Talk4Writing lessons next week and our first focus will get you hooked. We'll begin by exploring chase sequences in stories to create suspense using lots of drama and role-play to understand the genre. We can't wait to see what scary creations the children come up with!
