

Parking near the school

Please be mindful when parking near the school. Parents should not be parking at any neighbouring properties like the cemetery or at Checker's down the road.

Car park barrier

Please make sure you do not walk underneath the car park barrier at the front of the school. Please ensure you use the pedestrian access to the side of the school.

School uniform

The children all looked really smart this week—thank you. Please remember that trainers are not part of school uniform but ties are. It would also help us if you could name all uniform. After this week, we shall start writing names on any uniform that are not labelled.

School timings

We thought it might be helpful to remind everyone of the school day timings so that we can have a punctual start to the day.

If you are late in the morning, please go to the front office. Your child will be marked as 'late' in the register.

Reading

There is no doubt that the single best thing you can do to support your child's learning is to hear them read. All children from Reception to Year 6 would benefit from reading aloud at home. Ask questions about the story or the characters; talk about the illustrations; predict what might happen next; compare it to other similar stories and discuss why authors have made certain word choices. It will make such a difference.

Birthday books

To celebrate your child's birthday, instead of bringing sweets into school, we encourage bringing a 'birthday book'. Choose a book with your child and send it into school with them. We glue a special name plate in the book and upload a birthday message on to Facebook. The book then stays in the class reading area to enjoy.




Pre-loved uniform


