You could draw, paint, use materials to collage a picture, use natural materials found outside, use a computer or tablet to create some digital art or anything else you can think of.</p>

Answer the questions provided on the sheet.</p> <p><u>Could</u> The image provided for the 'could' task is not from the time of the Ancient Egyptians. Explain how you know this as well as answering the questions on the sheet.</p>
Given out: 28.09.23 Due in: 02.10.23	<p><u>Must</u> In our Talk4Writing lessons, we have been internalising our model text, 'The Day The Crayons Quit.' We have given you a copy of the text and text map and would like you to practise it, including the actions we have learnt in class, until you know it almost off by heart.</p> <p><u>Could</u> Once you are confident with the text, could you video yourself performing it, including actions. Why not challenge yourself to perform it without the text in front of you, using only the text map (pictures) to help you!</p>
Given out: 05.10.23 Due in: 09.10.23	<p><u>Must</u> Look at the pictures of Egyptian tomb paintings. They help us to understand new things about the Egyptians. For each picture, write down what we can learn about life in the Ancient Egyptian times. Think about what they are doing, what they are wearing and what they have around them.</p> <p><u>Could</u> We would like you to draw your own tomb painting showing an important thing in your life. It could be something you enjoy doing at home or at school. Think about the style of Egyptian paintings and try to draw yours in the same way but showing a modern way of life.</p>
Given out: 12.10.23 Due in: 16.10.23	<p><u>Must</u> In History we are learning about how the Pharaohs prepared for the afterlife. We would like you to list 10 items that you feel would be important to be placed in your tomb ready for the afterlife. Draw the item, label it and explain why you chose it.</p> <p><u>Could</u> The Ancient Egyptians believed that after you died you had to journey to the afterlife. A god called Anubis guarded the gates to the Afterlife and he decided who should be let in. How would you persuade him to let you in? Think about all of the amazing things you do in school and at home. What would you tell him about yourself?</p>
