Austin showed me a model bird his nana had bought for him in Madeira. He was able to tell me several interesting facts about the bird and model.



WE HAVE A GROWTH

At the William Alvey, we are proud to introduce a new culture of Growth Mindset. We want our children to have access to techniques that will enable them to develop their resilience so they can face life's many challenges. Parents can help to support us in our journey by using the same language and tools at home.

But what is Growth Mindset?

Based on the work of Carol Dweck, research has shown that people who believe their intelligence can be developed (thus demonstrating a growth mindset) outperform those who believe their intelligence is fixed (fixed mindset). When children learn that they can "grow their brains" and increase their intellectual abilities, they do better. This is the philosophy of 'I can' and 'I can't do it ...YET'.

> I can't do it...YET

It has been found that by focusing on the process which leads to learning (such as persevering and learning from mistakes), we can foster a growth mindset in our children. A child's mindset influences how they perceive and respond to their world. In a growth mindset, children understand that challenges and failure framed as learning opportunities can help them to become smarter. Struggling and working on a challenge or setback is good for the brain's neurological growth. Whereas in a fixed mindset children work to look smart, avoid challenges and shy away from taking risks where there is the possibility of failure. This can impact a child's development at school, sport and their relationships.

Fixed Mindset

Intelligence is static.

Leads to a desire to look smart and therefore a tendency to

- avoid challenges
- · give up easily due to obstacles
- see effort as fruitless
- · ignore useful feedback
- be threatened by others' success

Growth Mindset

Intelligence can be developed.

Leads to a desire to learn and therefore a tendency

- · embrace challenges
- · persist despite obstacles
- · see effort as path to mastery
- · learn from criticism
- · be inspired by others' success

How are we developing growth mindset at school?

Each class creates an environment in which growth mindset messages are promoted and where the differences between a fixed and growth mindset are evident and can be easily referred to. Growth mindset has been explained and shared with your children and is encouraged on a daily basis in each lesson. Rewards are given out for demonstrating a growth mindset and for 'not giving up'.

I'm not giving up

We focus on praising effort and the process of learning rather than intelligence. Research shows that when we praise children for being smart, it promotes a fixed mindset. It sends a message that their accomplishments are intelligence based. In contrast, praising children for working hard promotes a growth mindset. It sends a message that the child's effort is what led them to success.

How can you help your child develop a growth mindset?

- Talk **positively** about the mistakes you make or the mistakes your children make - your children will start to think of mistakes as a natural part of the learning process.
- Talk about experiences of challenges both past and present. Instead of saying, "I wasn't any good at maths at school." Try saying, "I used to find maths challenging too."
- Use the power of 'Yet'. You can't do it... yet but you will.
- Praise the process and the effort the child puts into an activity.







- Winners will be notified by Monday 13 December 2023

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
